Arts Leadership Residency for Indigenous, Black and/or People of Colour Artists/Arts Administrators

The Rozsa Foundation has just announced an Arts Leadership Grant. This grant is to support mid-career BIPOC artists and arts administrators who aspire to leadership roles in the arts (Artistic Directors, Executive Directors, Curators, Managing Directors, etc.) to undertake a year-long residency as a part time employee with an existing arts organization.

We at Quest Theatre are absolutely interested in speaking to anyone, inside or outside our current Family of Artists, who may have leadership ambitions in our practice of TYA (Theatre for Young Audiences). We would be open to supporting the development of an aspiring Artistic Associate (Play and Program Development, community engagement), an Arts Education Director (Artists in Residency, Online Arts Education, Drama Camps and Classes), or Arts Management Leader (strategic planning, partnership-building, budgeting, working with the board, advocacy, and community relations)
